COURSE DESCRIPTION	<p>The course is comprised of 3 mandatory units; providing learners with the opportunity to develop their reading, writing, talking and listening skills in order to understand straightforward texts.</p> <p>English: Analysis & Evaluation (National 4) The purpose of this unit is to provide learners with develop listening and reading skills in the contexts of literature, language and the media. Learners develop the skills needed to understand, analyse and evaluate straightforward texts.</p> <p>English: Creation & Production (National 4) The purpose of this unit is to help learners develop their talking and writing skills in a range of contexts. Learners develop the skills required to create and produce straightforward texts.</p> <p>English: Added Value Assignment:</p> <p>Learners apply language skills to investigate a chosen topic by understanding and evaluating straightforward texts, selecting relevant information from the texts, presenting findings on the topic and responding to oral questions relevant to the topic. The assignment will be a meaningful and appropriately challenging task, which should clearly demonstrate application of language skills at an appropriate level.</p>
COURSE ASSESSMENT	To gain a N4 qualification, learners must pass all units, including the Added Value assignment. Units are assessed as a pass or fail by the school. N4 Literacy is integrated into this course and a learner successfully completing N4 English will also have achieved N4 Literacy at N4 level.

LEVEL	Advanced Higher
ENTRY REQUIREMENTS	A previous pass at Higher English.
COURSE DESCRIPTION	<p>Course structure: The Course is made up of two mandatory Units. The main purpose of the Course is to provide learners with the opportunity to apply analytical and evaluative skills to a wide range of literary texts. Learners interpret complex literary forms, produce sophisticated language and develop the skills outlined in the Units. English: Analysis and Evaluation of Literary Texts (Advanced Higher). The purpose of this Unit is to provide learners with opportunities to develop skills in the analysis and evaluation of a wide range of complex and sophisticated literary texts to ensure that learners are exposed to a wide variety of writing styles, with varying purpose; equipping them with the skills, knowledge and experience they need to prepare them for further education and/or the world of work. English: Creation and Production (Advanced Higher) The purpose of this Unit is to provide learners with opportunities to create a range of complex and sophisticated texts. Critical reflection on the writing process is a core component of this part of the course as learners refine their craft by applying prior and current learning to as many genres of writing as possible- from poetry to prose, plays to short stories...working to learners' strengths and past experiences to form a true sense of what it is to be a writer.</p>
COURSE ASSESSMENT	<p>Component 1- Question Paper Literary Study ' Textual Analysis' (20 marks) One question on an unseen text that requires learners to utilise the skills of understanding, analysis and evaluation in the form of an extended response.</p> <p>Component 2- Question Paper Textual Analysis Section 2: 'Literary Study' (20 marks) An unseen comparative critical essay on texts studied in class.</p> <p>Component 3- Portfolio Writing (30 marks) The folio will comprise the production by learners of two written texts that address one/both the main language purposes- creative and discursive writing. Each piece is worth a maximum of 15 marks and should display evidence of complex and sophisticated writing.</p> <p>Component 4- Project- Dissertation (30 marks). This dissertation will give candidates an opportunity to demonstrate the following skills, knowledge and understanding: <i>independent planning, research and presentation of their knowledge and understanding of an aspect or aspects of literature</i>. The dissertation will be between 2500 and 3000 words.</p>

COURSE DESCRIPTION	<p>National 4 Media enables learners to both analyse and create media content. Learners think critically about the media and its role in everyday life, and develop an appreciation of media content in a cultural context and in the context of the media industry. Through analysing and creating media content, learners develop skills that enable them to engage more fully in society and in learning.</p> <p><u>Media: Analysing Media Content (National 4)</u> The purpose of this Unit is to develop the skills to analyse media content. COURSE DESCRIPTION	<p>Language is at the core of thinking. Learners reflect, communicate and develop ideas through language. The Course provides learners with the opportunity to develop skills in listening and talking, reading and writing, which are essential for learning, work and life; to use different media effectively for learning and communication; and to develop understanding of how language works, and use language to communicate ideas and information. The study of a modern language has a unique contribution to make to the development of cultural awareness, as it provides learners with a means of communicating directly with people from different cultures, enhancing their understanding and enjoyment of other cultures and of their own.
